The Capital Projects Construction Standards (CPCS), 3rd Edition, is effective as of January 2017 for use on all capital projects designed and constructed within Denver Water's service area system. The CPCS, 3rd Edition is published electronically in pdf format and in book form. The complete CPCS, 3rd Edition includes:

- General Conditions
- 215 Standard Technical Specifications
- 349 Standard Details

The CPCS, 3rd Edition is published in three volumes, consisting of the following:

- Volume 1 General Conditions and Standard Technical Specifications (Divisions 1-13)
- Volume 2 Standard Technical Specifications (Divisions 22-46)
- Volume 3 Standard Details (Divisions 1-40)

Upon request, Consultants and Contractors currently under contract with Denver Water or on our advanced prequalified list may receive one hard copy of the *CPCS*. The PDF version of the *CPCS* can be downloaded at: http://www.denverwater.org/CPCS

Since the first publication of the *CPCS* in 2011, Denver Water has worked to create a more comprehensive *CPCS* including civil, corrosion, electrical, mechanical, water treatment, structural and architectural disciplines. Please take the time to review this new edition since substantial changes have been made to the general content, specifications and details.

Denver Water's Standards library includes the *CPCS*, *Engineering Standards*, and *Computer Aided Drafting (CAD) Standards Manual*. These three standards collectively allow Denver Water to manage both capital and distribution construction projects. Projects prepared by or submitted to Denver Water are subject to the *CPCS*, the *Engineering Standards* when dealing with distribution pipe and service lines, and the *CAD Standards*.
